

THE BRICKYARD On Mill

The Brickyard on Mill Avenue is a reflection of ASU's strategic initiative to embed itself in the communities it serves. The complex is located at 699 S. Mill Avenue in downtown Tempe and houses both ASU and commercial entities, including retail stores such as Borders.

The Brickyard is home to the Ira A. Fulton School of Engineering Dean's Office and the School of Computing and Informatics (SCI). The administrative and faculty offices, as well as classroom, research and instructional labs for SCI are also located in the complex.

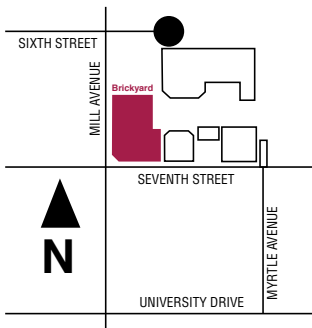
How to get to the Brickyard

The Brickyard is located at the intersection of Mill Avenue and 7th Street and underground parking is accessible from 7th Street.

From Sky Harbor Airport: Take Sky Harbor Boulevard east and merge onto AZ-153 South towards I-10 and AZ-143. Turn left onto East University Drive. Turn left onto South Mill Avenue.

From Tucson / Southern Arizona: Take I-10 west to exit 153B, Broadway Road/52nd Street. Merge onto West Broadway Road. From Broadway, turn left onto South Mill Avenue.

From Flagstaff / Northern Arizona: Take I-17 south to exit 200A, I-10 East. Follow I-10 East to exit 147, Loop 202 East. Exit Loop 202 East at Priest Drive towards Center Parkway and turn right. Turn left from Priest onto West Rio Salado Parkway. From Rio Salado turn right onto South Mill Avenue.

Orchid House



Since 2005, the Orchid House has been home to the Decision Theater, Edson Student Entrepreneur Initiative and Decision Center for a Desert City. The facility includes state-of-the-art collaborative resources and research areas designed for multimedia applications.

Artisan Court



The Artisan Court is one of the newest School of Engineering buildings and houses a student lounge and SCI classrooms. The classrooms are technologically advanced, with video broadcasting capabilities that support distance learning and collaborative research initiatives.
